- **District 7170 to Offer a Rotary Foundation Cultural Ambassadorial Scholarship**

For the first time, in the Rotary year 2005-2006, Rotary International District 7170 will offer a 3-month Rotary Foundation Cultural Ambassadorial Scholarship, in addition to an academic year scholarship. The Cultural Scholarship is for 3 months of intensive language training and cultural immersion abroad while living with a home-stay family and has a maximum of \$12,000 including transportation. The language training can take place in fifteen languages in more than twenty countries. The three-month scholarship, as well as the academic year scholarship, will be awarded for the Rotary year 2005-06, but the applications are due to the District Rotary Foundation Scholarship Sub-committee Chair by June 30, 2004. - **Applications for Ambassadorial Scholarships**

Each year our district offers one Ambassadorial Scholarship and the opportunity to be sponsored for a Rotary World Peace Scholarship. Incoming District Governor Peter Brellochs reminds us that applications for these scholarships for 2005-2006 and 2005 - 2007 are due by June 30, 2004. Candidates must be sponsored by a Rotary club in the district. SUNY Oneonta, Hartwick College, SUNY Binghamton, SUNY Cortland, Ithaca College, and Cornell University Scholarship Centers or Guidance Offices will all be receiving applications and information. Interested applicants can also acquire the necessary forms and information about the programs by visiting the Rotary International web site at www.rotary.org.

The Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarship program is the largest program of its kind in the world and offers scholars anywhere from \$13,000 - \$25,000 to study abroad. The World Peace Scholarship is a two-year, \$50,000 scholarship that allows graduate-level or higher students to add to their Peace Studies and Conflict Resolution skills at one of seven select institutions around the world. PROGRAM NOTES “Community Participation in Problem Solving and Action”

Mary Kane Trochim, Concept Systems Incorporated

Our guest speaker today was our own Mary Kane Trochim who spoke to us about Community Participation in Problem Solving and Action: Stories from the Public Health Front. Mary and her husband Bill run Concept Systems Incorporated, a small company that provides project consulting and research services in health issues identification and assessment. Using their own proprietary software, they gather data and information from a wide variety of sources related to a problem or an issue and then create a concept map which can help guide the appropriate people or organizations towards the results or solutions that they are seeking.

Most of their work these days relates to health care issues and the example that Mary showed us related well to that aspect of their business. Starting with the question: "A specific thing that a State Health Department could do to improve the health of older Americans is . . .," Mary walked us through the entire process of creating a concept map. The next step in the process is to gather as many responses to this question as possible from a wide variety of people who have a stake in the issue. From health department workers to health care providers, and elderly people who would benefit from the delivery of this potential, everyone who might have some input into the issue is given a chance to participate. From the list of ideas that are generated by the group, Concept Systems distills their responses down into a core group, and then applies the concept mapping software to the condensed results. The concept map groups the condensed results into "territories" which can then be labeled according to the types of results in each territory.

Ultimately, every group that has a stake in the issue ends up with an easy, well-defined set of options that they can then apply or make use of in whatever way they determine is most appropriate. Additionally, a third dimension can be added to the map giving priorities to each of the potential solutions or actions. By working mostly in the public sector, with organizations such as the Centers for Disease Control, the American Cancer Society, and the National Cancer Institute, Concept Systems hopes to be able to help create new and better health care solutions for everyone. Our thanks to Mary for her time and for a wonderful presentation!
